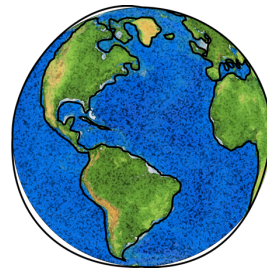


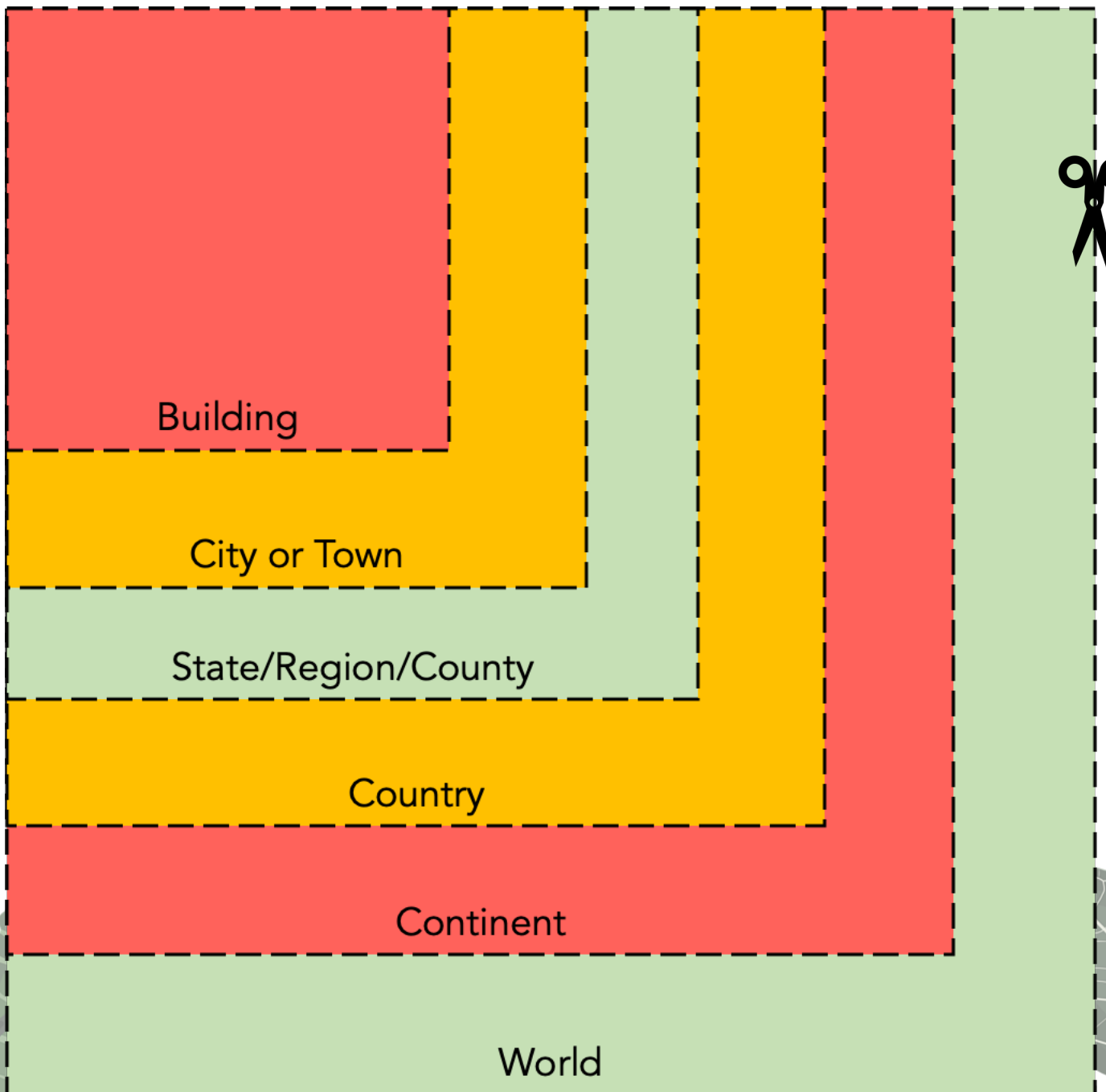

It is important to remember that even if the Lebialem Highlands aren't in our neighbourhood, we still make an impact from where we are in the world.

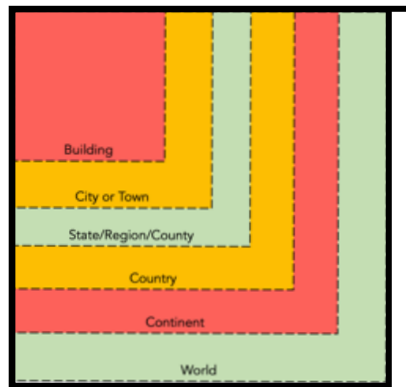
Children who don't live near the rainforest need to learn about helping to save them just as much as the children who do live there.



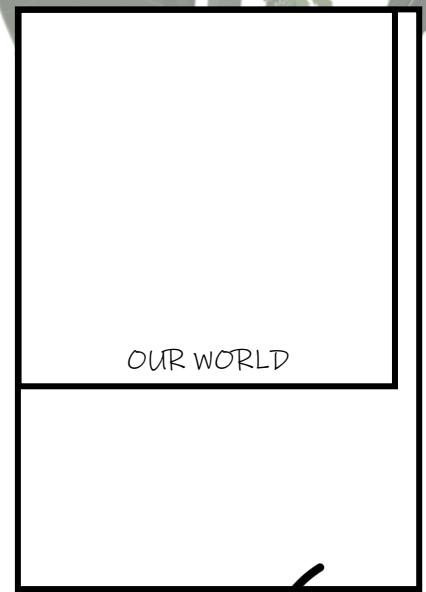
Start...

With adult supervision, cut out the big, colourful square on the previous page.

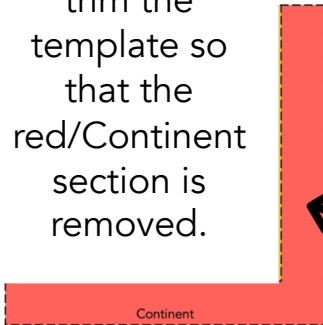
This is your template.



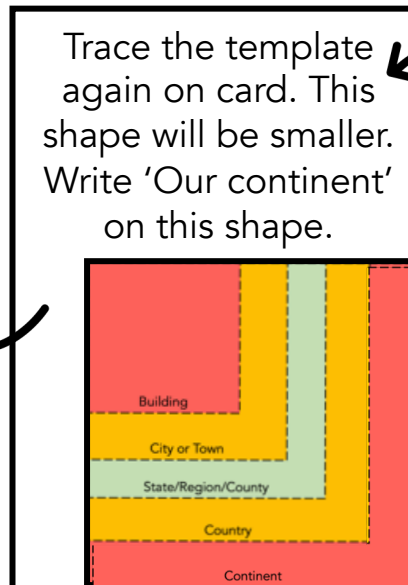
Trace the template on card and write 'Our World' on this shape.



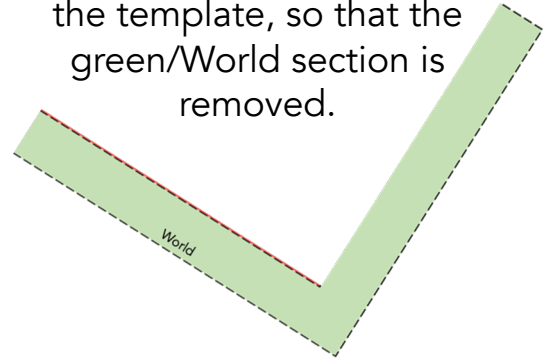
Again, you can trim the template so that the red/Continent section is removed.



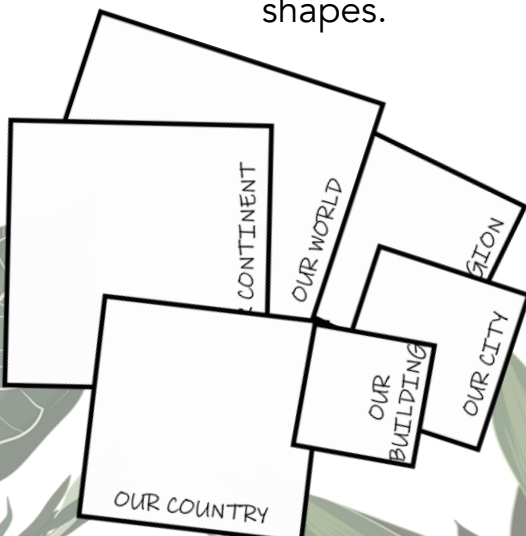
Trace the template again on card. This shape will be smaller. Write 'Our continent' on this shape.



Use the scissors to trim the template, so that the green/World section is removed.



Continue this until you have traced all six sizes of the template. Then cut out all six shapes.

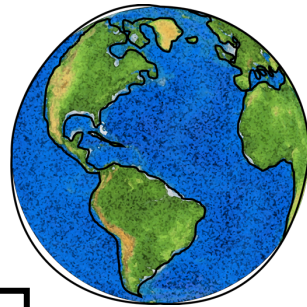


Great job! On each shape you will need to draw a picture or stick in a photograph that matches the title e.g. your building (this could be your house or your school) and your country (what's the name of the country you live in?)

Once you have a drawing for each shape/title, turn them over and write the same title on the blank side.

CHALLENGE: The images left on these two pages are the answers of a school student from Cameroon.

Cut them out and stick them onto the correct shape/title just like you did with your own answers.



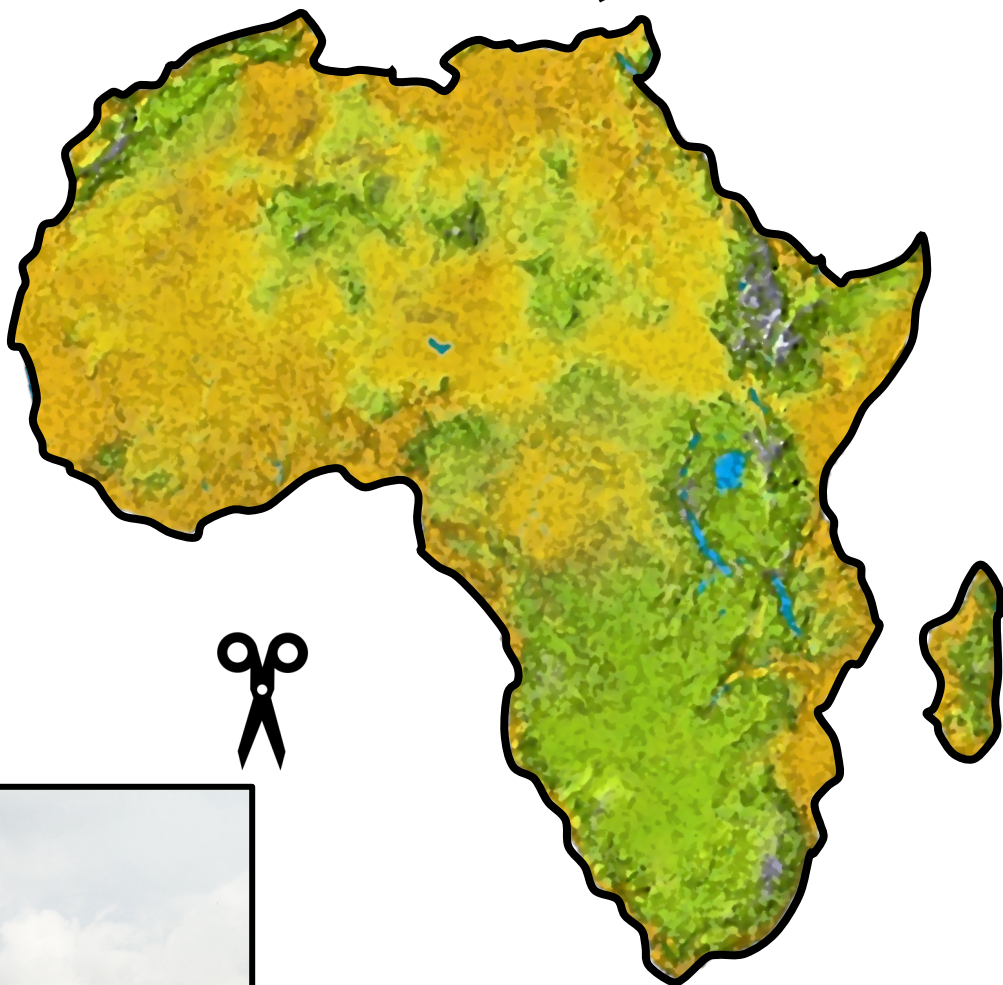

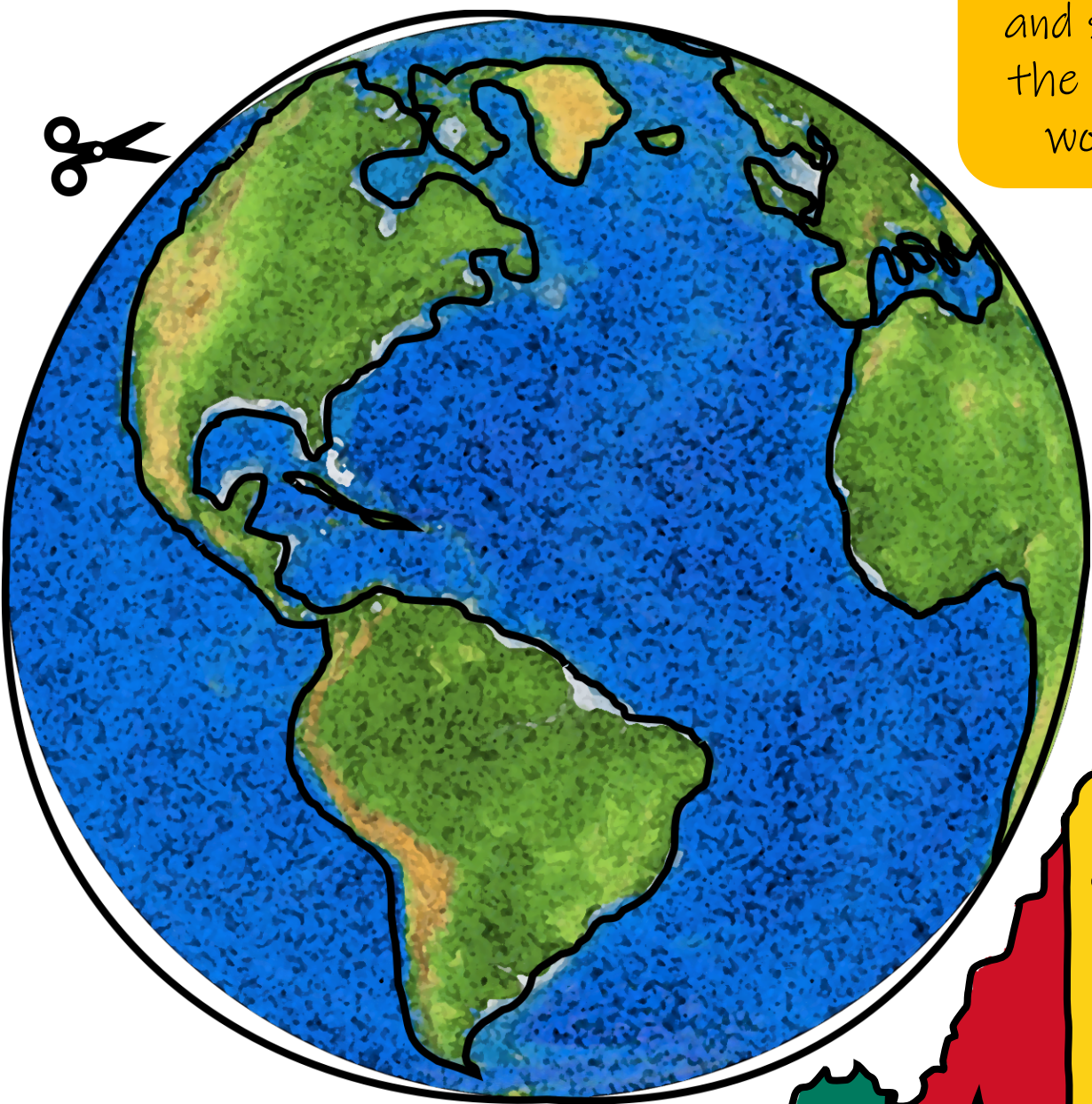
