


Draw a gorilla

Start off by sketching lightly with pencil

1.



Sketch 3 circles to be the head, neck and back. Make sure your head is taller and more upright that the other circles.

(Notice the middle 2 go up into the body)



Sketch 4 oval shapes that will become the arms and the legs.

3. Sketch round circles onto the arms and the front leg. These will help you draw the big muscles later on.


(You can don't need this on the back leg)




Don't forget to add small circles on the end of arms for hands and stretched ovals on the legs for feet!

Now using pen or a darker, solid pencil line...



Draw a line from the chin to the top of the head, not forgetting an indent for the forehead. 5.



Continue the line from the top of the head along the dip of the back, around the backside and finish on the muscle of the leg.




Draw the arms, separating the upper muscle from the lower arm with tufts of hair. Use zig-zag lines to make the bottom look fury too.



Starting at the curve you've already drawn for the backside, finish the leg in the same style as the arms.



Remember it is only the lower leg as it is on the side of the body we cannot see.


From the same backside curve, draw the back leg.




Add hands that look like knuckles and feet with extra long toes. You can also draw a tummy by joining the arm and leg.

Draw an ear and a face before colouring in.

Banana Bread



30 minutesPreparation



1 hour Cooking



10 Portions

You will need

Permission from an adult







1 teaspoon Mixed Spice



3-4 very ripe bananas – the browner the better!



150ml Sunflower Oil



300g Self-raising Flour



100g Soft Light Brown Sugar

You will also need a 900g loaf tin and baking parchment

Method


- 1. Preheat your oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4.
- 2. Grease and line the base and sides of your tin baking parchment.
- 3. Peel the bananas and mash them all in a large bowl using a fork.
- 4. Add the sugar, flour, baking powder and mixed spice to the bowl.
- 5. Mix them with a wooden spoon, then add the oil and mix together well.
- 6. Put the cake batter into your tin. Make sure its evenly spread out.
- 7. Bake for 1 hour. A skewer inserted into the centre of the cake should come out a little moist, but clean when the cake is finished.
- 8. Leave the cake inside the tin for 15 minutes when you first take it from the oven before turning it onto a wire rack to cool.

Use this template on a card like material to create your own masks. You pick the colour, or how to decorate. Collage? Paint? Colouring?

- 1. Cut out the outer line and use as a template for the head.
- 2. Cut out the middle shape for the facial features. Use this as a template or stick it straight on your gorilla head and decorate yourself.
- 3. Craft away!
- 4. Ask an adult to cut out eye holes.






River gorilla family drawn by Docaracolarte
